Priority Area 1: **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

Presbyterian's behavioral health initiatives work to address mental health and substance use to include prevention and treatment.

Peer Opioid Program Virtual Support

Peer Support Specialists assist patients who arrive in the emergency department with an opioid overdose or a substance/mental health-related episode.

Peer Support Specialists began virtually supporting patients in 2021.

48 people were trained on how to use naloxone in the event of an overdose.

68 people attended Community Opioid Misuse and Treatment Training sessions.

Priority Area 2: SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

At Presbyterian, we recognize that improving the health of our community means addressing their needs beyond the hospital or clinic. Priority initiatives aim to address unmet social needs through connecting individuals to community resources.

Addressing Intimate Partner Violence

Presbyterian partnered with Quay County Health Council to create a task force to respond to intimate partner violence. Local law enforcement received training on how to respond.

- **9** new Intimate Partner Violence Task Force members began their work.
- **11,593** people were reached with public service announcements via social media.
- **21** local police officers were trained on responding to intimate partner violence.







Priority Area 3: ACCESS TO CARE

Presbyterian's Access to Care initiatives increase individuals' ability to manage their health and navigate health and social care.

Flu Shot Distribution

Presbyterian distributed 757 free flu shots

344 in Logan

413 in Tucumcari



Diabetes Days

46 patients with diabetes received on-site retinal scanning and tele-endocrinology during a special "Diabetes Days" initiative to increase access to diabetes care.

Priority Area 4: HEALTHY EATING AND ACTIVE LIVING (HEAL)

Presbyterian's healthy eating and active living initiatives aim to prevent and manage chronic disease through improving access to local healthy food, health education and opportunities for physical activity.

28,078 people were reached with information on Healthy Eating
and Active Living via social media.

695 people attended community physical activity events including:

Presbyterian Healthcare Foundation matched proceeds from the Dan C. Trigg Memorial Hospital Auxiliary's annual Season's Greetings Fundraiser. The Auxiliary raised **\$10k** and Foundation gave **\$10k**. This money is used for equipment, lobby furniture, patient rooms and general campus improvements.
