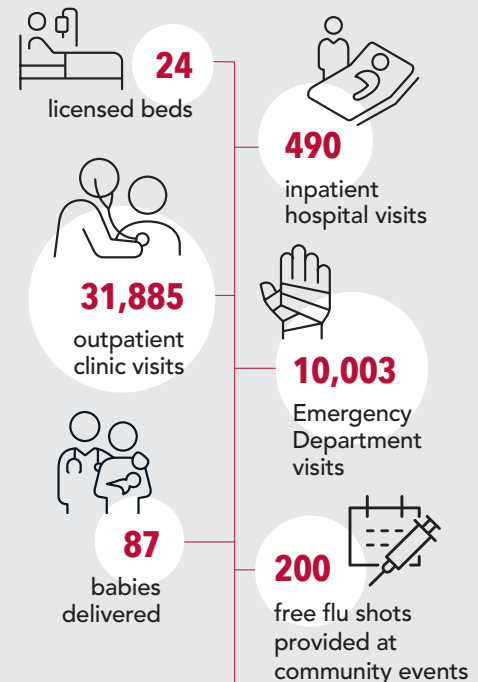
OUR SERVICES

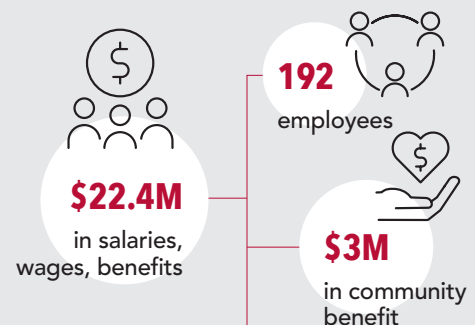


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COMMUNITY CARE BY THE NUMBERS

CARING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

- In 2023, we were recognized by the New Mexico Hospital Association for dramatically increasing our screenings to determine if patients needed help in areas such as mental health, smoking cessation and access to healthy food – and then connect them with the resources they need.
- In 2023, we began offering a produce prescription program that gives patients in need improved access to healthy food.
- We offer a program that helps patients recover when they are no longer acutely ill but need extra time to heal or strengthen before returning home. The program allows us to use the same bed for immediate hospital care or skilled nursing care.
- We offer all pregnant and parenting families in Socorro County a free home visitation program designed to promote the growth and development of happy, healthy babies in positive, nurturing families.
