Subject: Required Notifications for Critical Incident Reporting and Use of Restraints

Dear Provider:

Thank you for accepting our Presbyterian Turquoise Care member(s) for care and treatment at your facility. This letter is to inform you that parents/guardians of youth in New Mexico have a right to be informed when their child experiences a critical incident. That right is in alignment with the New Mexico Administrative Code, your provider contract, and state and federal policies.

If the child is in state custody, the guardian is New Mexico Children, Youth & Families Department (CYFD). CYFD must be informed immediately after any critical incident involving abuse, neglect, exploitation, elopement/missing status, emergency services, sexual behaviors, environmental hazard or death. This includes the occurrence of any physical or chemical restraint. Please ensure that you have accurate contact information for Presbyterian Health Plan, Inc. (Presbyterian) on file and that your employees are aware of this requirement.

The provider must work with the child's team to identify alternatives to the use of any type of restraint. Presbyterian requests that you notify the Critical Incident Management Team **immediately after an incident and upon any use of physical or chemical restraint** with a member.
