SOCORRO GENERAL HOSPITAL REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY 2024

WHO WE ARE

Socorro General Hospital (SGH), a nonprofit hospital that has been managed by Presbyterian Healthcare Services since 1976, provides inpatient and outpatient healthcare services to the residents of Socorro and Catron counties.

OUR SERVICES

At SGH the following medical specialties and services are offered: audiology and hearing aids, emergency department, family medicine, general surgery, home care and hospice, inpatient hospice, outpatient infusion, prenatal care, pediatrics, podiatry, full pulmonary function testing, radiology, rehabilitation services, women's health, and urgent care.

CARING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

As a community-based healthcare provider, our focus is on providing safe, compassionate and equitable care that keeps our patients and members healthy. That includes:

- **Promoting healthy families.** For 15 years, we have offered all pregnant and parenting families in Socorro County a free home visitation program designed to promote the growth and development of happy, healthy babies in positive, nurturing families. Home visits and educational materials help parents learn about child development and parenting. Each year more than 113 families and 143 children are referred for home visits.
- **Promoting connection.** For reducing transportation barriers for patients and enhancing community connectivity, SGH was awarded honorable mention in 2024 in the annual Quest for Excellence Awards of the New Mexico Hospital Association.
- Promoting senior health. Our Heritage Program for adults ages 55 and older who are
 Medicare eligible is an outpatient behavioral health program that helps individuals learn
 to cope with emotional problems, maximizing their ability to function independently. In
 2024, we provided 4,970 individual or group visits.



Another priority for us is to engage, retain and celebrate our talented team members. Dr. Trista Hughes, a doctor of family medicine and obstetrics at SGH, received an inaugural Healthcare Champion Award from the New Mexico Early Childhood Education and Care Department in 2024. She was one of four providers recognized for going above and beyond to connect patients with the department's Home Visiting and Family Infant Toddler programs, which support the well-being of children and their families.
