

Experience Clovis, New Mexico

Situated near the Texas border and known for its early ties to rock 'n roll, Clovis, New Mexico, is home to Plains Regional Medical Center, a not-for-profit hospital with 100 licensed beds that serves the eastern New Mexico and West Texas areas, managed by Presbyterian Healthcare Services and guided by a community-based Board of Trustees.

The Community

With a population of more than 45,000, Clovis is a family-friendly city that neighbors the Cannon Air Force Base with a community that has:

- Public and private schools, including Clovis Municipal Schools and Clovis Christian Schools, both with grades K-12
- Various higher education options, including Clovis Community College that
 sits on a 100-acre campus and offers more than 60 degrees and certificates,
 and Wayland Baptist College at Clovis, which focuses on working adults who
 are wanting to obtain a bachelors or master's degree. Also in nearby Portales,
 NM, is Eastern New Mexico University, a 4-year university offering bachelors
 and graduate degrees.

- Multiple churches of various religious affiliations

Things to Do

Clovis is known for having one of the busiest **community calendars** in the state, as the city offers a variety of events situated around the city's culture, history and outdoor recreational facilities. With more than 300 days of sunshine, there are many things to do in Clovis, such as:

- Spending time with the family at the 3,200-acre Ned Houk Park that offers basketball courts, baseball fields, an archery range, motor sports racetrack, trails for ATVs, a disc golf course, a model airplane flying area, three lakes and a picnic area
- Attending the iconic annual Draggin' Main Music Festival every June this
 week-long festival combines different genre of music, drive-in food stops,
 tours of Norman Petty Studios and classic car shows
- Experiencing the arts at a performance at the Clovis Community College Cultural Art Series
- Golfing at the 18-hole Colonial Park Golf Course
- Antiquing and shopping in **Downtown Clovis**
- Participating in city-league recreation at the Roy Walker Community Center that has two full-sized gymnasiums for youth, men, women and mixed league play in volleyball and basketball
- Cooling off at the Clovis Aquatic Center, Potter Pool or the Hillcrest Splash Park
- Day trips to water and snow skiing, mountains, lakes and other New Mexico historical and cultural sites
