

Explore Historical Tucumcari, New Mexico

Situated on historical Route 66, the town of Tucumcari has an old-west charm that keeps the rural community and pioneer spirit alive. Tucumcari is home to Dr. Dan C. Trigg Memorial Hospital, a not-for-profit acute-care hospital with 25 licensed beds, owned and operated by Presbyterian Healthcare Services and lead by a local Board of Trustees.

- A public school district with grades K-12, Tucumcari Public Schools
 has a low teacher-to-student ratio that enables a more personalized

 offers associate degrees and certificate programs, as well as a bachelor's
 degree in business administration and early childhood education in
 cooperation with The University of New Mexico
- Move-in ready homes, or land for building, ranching and farming
- Multiple churches of various religious affiliations

Things to Do

Tucumcari and the surrounding areas offer a wide range of outdoor and unique old-west experiences including:

- Watching vintage aircraft race through the sky at the annual Tucumcari Air Show
- Canoeing, boating, water skiing, and more across Ute Lake and Conchas Lake State Parks
- Listening to traditional bluegrass music at the County Exhibit Hall, the NM Music Showcase, or at other venues throughout the area
- Photographing and viewing the more than 40 locally painted murals throughout the town, restored classic cars, and historic Route 66 neon
- Golfing at the local 18-hole golf course, or the nearby 12 Shores Golf Club at Ute Lake
- Exploring museums such as Mesalands Dinosaur Museums and Natural Sciences Laboratory, or the Tucumcari Historical Museum, which is set in a 1900s schoolhouse
